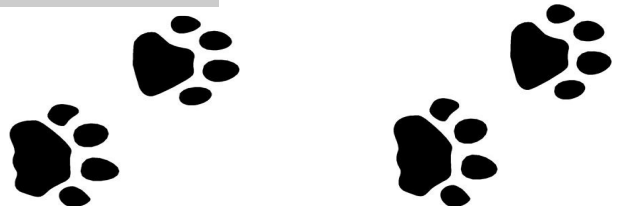

BINGO—Get Involved!!

The majority of the funding used for community service and projects comes from the weekly BINGO games sponsored by the Winthrop Harbor Lions Club.

3 hours a month—this is what we ask members for to help run Bingo. 3 hours a month can make an enormous impact. Do any of these opportunities fit into your schedule?

3:00. Set up.

Set-up boards, bingo machine and monitors. Update chalk boards with new game information. Start coffee.

3:30. Players begin arriving.

4:30. Office workers arrive.

Set up office. Sell cards until BINGO starts at 7:00.

4:45. Sellers arrive.

2 Pull tab and raffle sellers are needed. Raffle sales stop at 6:45.

Pull tab sales go later, depending on attendance and sales.

6:45. Callers arrive.

Raffle calling starts right away.

6:45. Floor workers arrive.

Workers cover the floor,

answer questions, call back numbers, and deliver payouts to the winners.

7:00. BINGO starts.

8:15. Pull tab sales stop.

9:40. Games end.

Clean up.
